Women in the Outdoors Courses:

Archery 1-2-3

You will learn how to shoot compound and/or traditional bows at targets 10-15 yards away. You will be able to select archery and fitting equipment that meets your needs.

Freshwater Fishing

You will learn the basics of casting techniques, fish habitat and species identification. This course offers information, which will help you select a rod and reel, line weights, baits and lures, waders, fishing vests and other accessories.

Roughing It Easy

This course will ease you into camping if you've never done it before, and will give helpful tips on equipment, fire building, and outdoor cooking.

Pond Ecology
